Important Notes

- 1. All entries and payments to be made through BROE. Payment to be made before the draw.
- 2. Entries open at 09:00 on Tuesday, 20 December 2022
- 3. Entries close at **12:00 (noon) on Sunday, 29 January 2023** unless closed earlier on an event or division basis due to oversubscription.
- 4. The draw will take place on Sunday, 29 January 2023, coordinated from PCRC, and will be released on our website by 22:00 that day.
- 5. Pewter tankards will be awarded to the fastest crew in each event, where three or more crews have entered.
- 6. On-site catering will be available at boating area throughout the day.
- 7. The Organising Committee reserves the right to alter the course or remove certain events due to adverse weather conditions.

Primary Conditions of Entry (further competitor instructions and conditions will be made available at a later date)

- 1. Should the Head need to be cancelled either before or during the competition on the grounds of safety we will endeavour to make a partial refund of entry fees once accurate costs have been calculated.
- 2. The race is upstream and usually into a head wind; all crews who enter must be of sufficient competency to race in these conditions.
- 3. For large events, we may use BROE's CRI to band these into smaller categories.
- 4. For Juniors:
 - a. J15 events: Only open to J15s; J14s are not permitted to race up
 - b. J16 events: J15s may enter
 - c. J18 events: J16s and above may enter
- 5. Where necessary, Masters events may be combined, and race times adjusted using the British Rowing handicapping system.
