Important Notes

- 1. All entries and payments to be made through BROE. Payment to be made before the draw.
- 2. Entries open at 20:00 on Sunday 8 December 2024.
- 3. Entries close at **12:00 (noon) on Sunday, 26 January 2025** unless closed earlier on an event or division basis due to oversubscription.
- 4. The draw will take place on Sunday, 26 January 2025, coordinated from PCRC, and will be released on our website by 22:00 that day. Please see the following for full details: https://peterboroughcityrowing.co.uk/event/peterborough-head-of-the-nene-2025
- 5. Start times for divisions 2 and 3 may be amended slightly based on the level of entries for each division. These will be confirmed when the draw is published.
- 6. Tankards will be awarded to the fastest crew in each event, where three or more crews have entered.
- 7. On-site catering will be available at the Embankment boating area throughout the day.
- 8. There is no drinking water source at the Embankment, please bring sufficient drink with you.
- 9. The Organising Committee reserves the right to alter the course or remove certain events due to adverse weather conditions.

Primary Conditions of Entry (further competitor instructions and conditions will be published together with the draw)

- 1. Should the Head need to be cancelled either before or during the competition on the grounds of safety we will endeavour to make a partial refund of entry fees once accurate costs have been calculated.
- 2. The race is upstream and usually into a head wind; all crews who enter must be of sufficient competency to race in these conditions.
- 3. Competitors, coxes and their coaches are reminded that persons using this water course do so entirely at their own risk and are solely responsible for deciding whether or not they are competent to use the water course in the prevailing weather conditions; **this decision may be taken by an individual or with their coach / crew**.
- 4. For large events, we may use BROE's CRI to band these into smaller categories.
- 5. All Junior entries are required to be in the J15 age band or above.
- 6. Where necessary, Masters events may be combined, and race times adjusted using the British Rowing handicapping system.
